-yron C. Lake added a grist mill, kiln, and livery stable to the hotel and eating house, and renamed the town after himself. In 1864, Washoe County was consolidated with Roop County, and Lake's Crossing became the largest town in the county. Lake earned the title "founder of Reno." By January 1863, the Central Pacific Railroad had begun laying tracks east from Sacramento, California, eventually connecting with the Union Pacific Railroad at Promontory, Utah to form the first transcontinental railroad. When the railroad reached Nevada in 1868, Lake ensured that his crossing was included in its path by deeding part of his land to a railroad organizer who promised to build a depot Lake Mansion sits in the shadow at Lake's Crossing. Lake's home, built in 1877, was later relocated to the corner of Arlington and Court Sts. -- Reno

A SIMPLIFIED GUIDE FOR REMEMBERING BOARD VULNERABILITY

Think in sets of four boards, e.g., 1 - 4, 5 - 8, 9 - 12, and 13 - 16. The vulnerability for the first set, 1 - 4, starts O (noone vulnerable), then N (N-S vulnerable), then E (E-W vulnerable), and finally B (both vulnerable). For the second set of four, move the first O to the end of the set (5 - 8: NEBO). For the third set, move the first N-S to the end (9 - 12: EBON). For the fourth set, move the first E-W to the end (13 - 16: BONE). Repeat the system for sets 17-20 (like 1 - 4), 21 - 24 (like 5 - 8), and 25 - 28 (like 9 - 12). Then all you have to think of is a) which set of 4? and b) which cycle? EASY, HUH?

Always plan a second bid before you choose the first.
