

The Art of Declarer Play

"The more you sweat in practice,

the less you bleed in battle."

Now how's that for a quote from a bridge book? Tim Bourke's latest effort (with Justin Corfield) targeting more advanced players opens with this quote and uses it as a theme throughout, providing excellent examples of card play that will challenge you to think through many issues in advance so that you'll be prepared for them when they come up at the table. The authors follow Sun Tzu's *Art of War* approach, emphasizing **recognition** of the key issue, **visualization** of how to address it and **realization** (execution) of the solution.

Here's a fun example. In the hand below, trick 1 starts with the ♥2, followed by the 9, J, 7. East continues with a trump, which turns out to be stiff. If you get stuck, come see me at the bookstore to check out the book! (This is Hand #6: Two Aces Wrong.)

The authors guide the reader through identifying and weighing possible solutions for a 10th trick through visualization of East's likely holdings and how to leverage each. This leads to an elegant solution to maximize your chances.
